



Cecil Craig Harris passed away Monday, August 6, 2007 at Duke University Hospital. He was born February 20, 1925 in Raymond, Mississippi to Cecil Ernest Harris and Ora Harris. He was predeceased by his wife of 53 years, Bobbie Lee Russell Harris. He is survived by three children: Rebecca Harris Moore and son-in-law William R. Moore of LaGrange, GA; David Russell Harris of Raleigh, NC; Donald Ernest Harris and daughter-in-law Lynn Shackelford Harris of Wilmington, NC. He is also survived by three grandchildren: Russell Blake Moore and wife Holly Evans Moore of Greer, SC; Russell Bryant Moore and wife Stacy Cross Moore of Hoover, AL; Clayton Russell Harris of Wilmington, NC. He is also survived by his brother, Bruce Kelly Harris of Clinton, MS.

Mr. Harris served as a B-17 co-pilot during WWII as a member of the 457<sup>th</sup> Bomb Group of the Eighth Air Force stationed at Glatton, England. He was educated at Hinds Junior College and the University of Tennessee. He worked as a development engineer at Oak Ridge National Laboratory, Oak Ridge, Tennessee from 1950-1967. In 1967 he joined the Clinical Faculty of the Department of Radiology at Duke University where he worked until his retirement as Associate Professor Emeritus of Radiology in 1992. After his retirement, he became active in the Eighth Air Force Historical Society and the Eighth Air Force Heritage Museum in Pooler, GA.
